On Wednesday June 15, 2022, the Mission Board sponsored a potluck dinner and welcomed Amanda Pankov to speak about her missionary work and job with SEND International. It was great to be able to gather together for a wonderful meal and to listen to her and her husband, Sergei, and meet their one and a half year old son, Nathan.

The last time Amanda visited Central Baptist she was saying goodbye as she thought that her work with SEND would be ending. However, God had other plans for her and SEND offered her a job as a missionary coach. Her job entails working with individuals that are looking to follow the Lord as a missionary and spread his Gospel. She helps them with the

paperwork and training, but most importantly works with them to know their WHY. Why do they want to do missionary work as it is more than just to travel the world.

Amanda, Sergei (who is originally from Russia), Nathan and a baby due in October, live in the northeast corner of CT and have purchased an old home that Sergei finds pleasure in remodeling. He spoke of how different his life is now from ten years ago ever since he found church and God. The family has been recently called to help Ukrainian refugees after the war started. Many of the refugees are women and children as the men were required to stay and fight. Many speak Russian and are living in countries where the people trying to help them do not. They have been called to go to Romania for a month in July to help at some camps or hotel camps that have been set up by local pastors.

They hope to go and help with translation, set up day camps for kids whose mothers are working, provide a listening ear as many have been through so much trauma, and share the gospel. While they are ready to go and have tickets purchased they are waiting for visa approval for Sergei and asked for prayers that they receive good news before their July 2<sup>nd</sup> departure.

They hope to set up a Facebook or Instagram page to keep everyone updated on their plans and mission. This will be a private group; but, if you are interested in following them please email Amanda at [apankov@send.org](mailto:apankov@send.org) to be sent an invite to the page. We will continue to update the congregation as well.

What a beautiful night and family. God calls us all to use our skills to help others and they are definitely a true testament to that.

**The Persecuted Church****The “Stans”**

Whatever does this title mean?

“Stan” is an ancient Persian word that means “country.”

There are seven countries with names ending in “stan.” They are:

Afghanistan(1) Pakistan(8) Kazakhstan(47) Kyrgyzstan(?) Tajikistan(45) Turkmenistan(25)  
Uzbekistan(21)

Five are in Central Asia and two are in South Asia -Afghanistan and Pakistan.

The numbers following the listed countries refer to their ranking in the World Watch List for global persecution of Christians.

All these have a common denominator of having a majority Islamic population that is at a family, community and sometimes governmental level opposed to the practicing of the Christian faith.

Afghanistan has the dubious distinction of being #1 since the Taliban re-assumed power last year and in most areas of the country, to be a Christian means you are on a list to be eliminated.

If they are able, many Christians are fleeing to Pakistan although life there can be tenuous as in the areas bordering Afghanistan, Christians are barely tolerated.

Life for a Christian in Pakistan is hard as to be a Christian is to be a second class citizen at best. Just last month two leaders in the Anglican church were gunned down as they left Sunday morning worship. One died.

For Christians in Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan it means that worship services will be regularly raided and leaders arrested. The government regards churches as a threat to its rule and as a foreign influence, so control or elimination is their goal.

Although Tajikistan and Kazakhstan are much further down numerically on the list, the conditions are little better than the other Central Asian countries. Government crackdowns on churches and leaders are a regular part of life, even to the confiscation of property.

Kyrgyzstan is currently not listed but only because last years new Constitution has not been fully implemented and it contains significant religious restrictions. The new Religion Law requires state permission for congregations to exist and assemble. They must own a building to meet and 200 adult members are required for registration. The state requires the name, DOB, citizenship, address and passport of each member. As you can see the Church will be driven underground in this country very soon.

I hope this overview gives you some insight into how blessed we are to live and worship in a free country and how much we need to regularly pray for our persecuted fellow Christians.





the sand.


I noticed that at many times along



