





PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

The members of our various church boards started formulating a long range plan for the congregation back in January. It has been a slow moving process but we are making headway. At the Annual Meeting in May we planned to share a first look at our goals with everyone. I want to share it here. We began by identifying five goals. They are as follows:



- 1) Provide each member with the tools needed to build a solid foundation in God's Word.
- 2) Identify roles that each member of the congregation can understand and play to create a loving church family.
- 3) Instruct members of the church in how they can be missionaries in a world that needs to know Jesus.
- 4) Encourage others to share their faith in Jesus with others.
- 5) Equip and prepare members of the church to be disciples and help them find their places in expanding the Kingdom of God.

It is a start and needs more refinement. That will come in the months ahead. At the same time the Board of Deacons has been exploring a book by Nelson Searcy titled, <u>Fusion</u>. The book talks about welcoming guests and helping them find their place in the church's ministry. You will notice that we are making changes to the reception area off the parking lot. We hope to make it more inviting and visitor friendly. We will also be looking for more greeters to help welcome the guests. There will be a few more changes to our protocols as time goes on. The board of Christian Education is also doing things a little differently. You will notice QR codes popping up and online registrations. We are trying to modernize some of our systems to reach the younger families. The Mission Board is looking to provide more opportunities to serve both locally and internationally. The Trustees are looking for ways they can support our ongoing discipleship and evangelism programs. By the end of the year we hope to see all of our Boards and committees rowing in the same direction as we seek to serve the Lord. Stay tuned. The best is yet to come!

Comparing the financial plan to actuals after the first four months of the year reveals that planned giving is approximately 8% (\$8,000) ahead of the YTD budget for that line item. This increase in planned giving is covering a 25% shortfall in Nursery School revenue (approximately \$8,000 YTD). The remaining difference of approximately \$14,000 in revenue between YTD actual and YTD plan can be attributed to not having to transfer trust funds to the financial plan as anticipated when the plan was developed. The YTD expense numbers show that actual expenses are approximately \$13,000 (7.0%) lower than YTD planned amounts. Overall, the 2024 financial plan is tracking well.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!



Juneteenth ~ June 19th

While people celebrate on July 4th as their Independence Day, most Black Americans claim June 19th to celebrate their Independence coinciding with the end of slavery. It is called "Juneteenth National Independence Day" or "Jubilee Day" or "Freedom Day." The holiday name is a combination of "June" and "nineteenth" for it was on this day in 1865 when the final enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation was done at the end of the American Civil War. Early celebrations were held by Christians in churches and the freedmen's Bureau. The day was finally recognized as a federal holiday in 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law.

The Annual Father's Day Car Show is coming on Sunday, June 16th.

The show begins immediately following church at 10:30 am and runs until 1:00 pm. This is our biggest outreach event of the year. Last year we had 106 cars and it brought in several hundred people throughout the event. We are looking for members of the church to be present and to let people know that you belong to the church.
