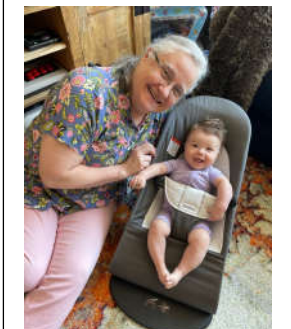

Board of Missions

As you may remember, Missionary Amanda Pankov and her family came to meet with us in June and shared with us their plans to go to Romania to work with Ukrainian refugees. They were waiting on her husband Sergei's visa and asking for prayers. I am happy to report that those prayers worked and on July 1st despite some last-minute concerns, Sergei got his visa and the family touched down in Romania to begin their mission of serving as they had prayed for.



They have spent the last two weeks getting to know the culture and working with others to set up the camp for kids that their family is hosting. Camp began on Friday July 8th. They also have been visiting a nearby refugee camp and offering their services where they can be used to help those in need and helped with the purchase of food to be sent to the Ukraine. Their son, Nathan, has enjoyed spending time and playing with the kids and they continue to get to know the culture. Sergei was treated to a birthday celebration by some locals as well.

One of the most beautiful and heartbreaking moments so far in their mission has been that they have been asked by the Ukrainian mothers to share the pictures and videos that they have taken of their children in camp so that they can send them to the dads that had to stay behind to defend their country. It is sad to think that they must watch their children grow through pictures and videos because of this war.

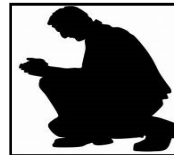
Please continue to keep Amanda and her family in your prayers as they continue to do God's work to help those impacted by this war.

The Persecuted Church



Pakistan

We mentioned Pakistan last month, but here are three stories about life there as a Christian.

Kanwal, a seventh grader in a village, has little opportunity for a good education. Her parents are poor, as Christians are only able to obtain menial jobs. Her father is a day laborer and often is unable to find work. Her mother is a servant in a wealthy family's home. They cannot afford books so the VOM ministry donates Urdu language children's Bibles to these families. "I love reading my Bible" says Kanwal, "and I also read to my parents which makes them very happy." She will grow up knowing she is loved and valued by God even though the society tells her she is worth nothing.

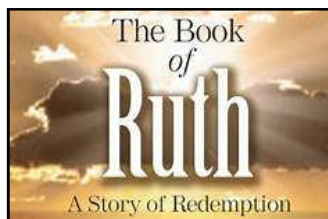
William Siraj, a lay pastor near Peshawar on the northeast corner of Pakistan close to the Afghanistan border, was returning home from preaching Sunday morning, January 30th, when he was shot and killed by Islamists. This area of Pakistan is particularly dangerous for Christians as the deep seated extreme attitudes in Afghanistan spill over in these communities.

Pakistan was founded in 1947 and although its founding father espoused principles of equality and freedom of religion, the reality is that the country has always been staunchly Islamic and fundamentalist in nature. Part of that resulted in Blasphemy laws being part of the penal code from the beginning. They were strengthened in the 1980's with a mandatory life sentence for desecration of the Quran and the death sentence for defiling the name of Muhammad, the Prophet. These laws have been increasingly misused against Christians in recent years. The most well known case is of Aasia Bibi, who was accused after an argument with a co-worker in 2009. She was arrested and sentenced to death. After years of appeals she was finally acquitted in 2018 by the Supreme Court. She and her family had to flee to Canada to remain safe from threats against their lives. In January this year, Zafar Bhatti, who had been convicted of blasphemy and sentenced to life imprisonment, was appealing his case in district court when the judge decided to change his sentence to the death penalty. There are six Christians currently on death row for blasphemy convictions. On 15 occasions in the last 20 years Christians accused of blasphemy have been murdered before a trial could take place and often the communities those accused are from suffer violent reprisals also.

The Christian community in Pakistan is only 2% of the population, but they continue to proclaim the Good News of salvation in Christ despite the dangers. They deserve our prayerful support.

Call the office if you are interested in volunteering. We'd love to set up a rotation in the nursery.



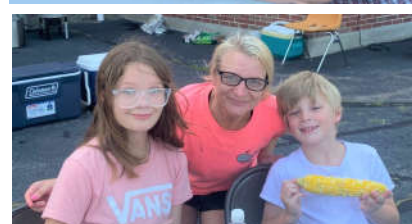
Come Hear about the Kentucky Mission Trip
