

Pastor Cal will be leading part 2 of our study in the Gospel of John.


Begins 9/13, Monday nights at 6:30 pm

We've all been hearing the latest news on the coronavirus. The Delta variant is causing a rise in cases in the area. We want everyone to be safe. Our policy at church is that people who are fully vaccinated do not need to wear a mask. Having said that, please feel free to wear a mask if you feel more comfortable doing so or if you haven't been vaccinated. We will get through this together.

PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

Flexibility! That's the word that I preach when we go on mission trips. We plan. We prepare. We engage. We face unexpected challenges. Then we adapt to the things we hadn't planned for. We adjust for the changing environment. We rethink our assumptions. We make a new plan and move forward again.

Life over the last eighteen months has been like one long, unending mission trip. We have had to shift and adjust time after time. Just when we thought we had it figured out, we'd have to make a new plan. That's flexibility. I don't think anyone would have envisioned that we would still be battling the coronavirus going into a second fall season.

Thankfully we have a vaccine that has radically changed things. Although there has been an uptick of Covid cases recently, we are hopeful that things will soon move back in the right direction. So we are planning to move forward with our fall schedule. There will be some adjustments though.

You will see a number of people wearing masks at church. We are encouraging people to do what they need to do to feel safe. So if wearing a mask relieves your anxiety, then please wear a mask. We are asking those who have chosen not to get vaccinated to wear a mask for your own protection. If parents want their children to wear masks, we encourage them to do so, especially if they are too young to be vaccinated. We will try to maintain social distances with all of our activities for adults and children. We will have sanitizing stations throughout the church building and will encourage each other to use them.

In upcoming newsletters and bulletins you will see a number of programs and opportunities that are being planned. We have several small group studies in the works. Our youth ministry will include Sunday school and two youth group options. Our men's and women's ministries will be meeting regularly. Our choir will return in October and our newly organized praise team will be rehearsing. We have a concert planned in November and are already thinking about Christmas.

We will continue to livestream our Sunday services and upload them to You Tube for those who feel most comfortable worshipping from home. We will offer a couple of Zoom programs for those who would like to be involved in a small group studies but are nervous about returning. Although the last scheduled parking lot service took place last week, we are looking for alternatives to indoor worship for those who have enjoyed the experience of being together in the parking lot.

We are making plans. You will see many of those plans announced in this newsletter. That brings me back to that word, "flexibility." Only time will tell how our plans play out this fall. We will prepare for a busy season ahead and make adjustments accordingly. Thank you for your continued support with your presence and your prayers. We will get through this and find our way forward. For God always makes a way.

The pandemic has made for very long days with much stress and anxiety, but the support of the community keeps WARM going strong. Because of YOU they are able to do this!!

Summer Lunches: WARM distributes over 4,000 bagged lunches Monday-Friday to summer camps and neighborhood centers in Washington County, RI while school is out.

Laos

The Persecuted Church



If it were not for the Vietnam war, few of us would have heard of Laos, let alone know where it is. But because of that most of us do. It is still an impoverished Communist country that is ruled with an iron hand and ranks number 20 on the World Watch list for persecuting countries.

There are approximately 227,000 Christians in the country of 7+ million and they mostly meet in house churches as government regulation makes it virtually impossible to build a church. Churches, whether having a building or meeting in homes, are supposed to be registered and are closely watched. The primary religion is Buddhism, which is tolerated by the government. In the rural areas animistic religion predominates.

A villager was visiting another province and heard the gospel for the first time while there. He was impressed by what he heard and took his wife, who was severely ill, and child there to hear for themselves. Whilst there, his wife was prayed for and was healed. The family committed their lives to Christ before they returned home. When the man's parents and the village head heard of their conversion they were ordered to recant or be expelled from their village. Having experienced God's power in their lives, they moved to the next village and started to build a home on some land they farmed there, but when that village's headman heard they were Christians he ordered them to stop and reported them to the authorities. They have appealed this action and are waiting on God to resolve their problems, but in the meantime they are reliant on assistance from a Christian ministry, VOM, to provide for their needs.

Stories like this are common when people become Christians and leave the locally practiced faith as persecution from family and village authorities is the norm in rural Laos.

We need to be grateful for our freedom and remember the many in our world who suffer because of their relationship with and devotion to Jesus their Savior.



St. Pauly's Shed

Do you have clothing that you don't want anymore and would like to donate it to those in need? Now is a good time to put them in a plastic bag and bring them to St. Pauly's Shed. The shed is located in back of the church parking lot.

Do you wonder where these donations go? Once the shed is emptied by St. Pauly workers, the items are taken to their distribution centers to separate items by categories: infant, children, adolescents, adults and household items (sheets, towels, curtains, etc.). Items are also separated according to warm climate and cold climate needs. We believe the items are shipped around the world to those in need, and if there is a current crisis (such as Haiti's earthquake right now), that may become a priority to help those people.

Our church receives 4 cents per pound of donated items per month. Last month's check to the church was around \$93.






