PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,



Several years ago, my dad and mom were regularly attending services in Norwich. One day I asked my dad if he wanted to join the church? I've never been one to put pressure on people. He had been attending a few years and I was wondering why he hadn't joined. Was we waiting for an invitation?

He asked me why he should join a church? I had never thought about the question before. I grew up in the church and when I was baptized, I became a member. I joined every church I attended after that. I never really thought about the "Why".

When I met with him a few days later I had come up with four reasons why someone should join a church.

- First, if someone truly feels God is calling them to attend and get involved in a local church, then it is natural to want to belong.
- Second, if you believe in the ministry of that congregation and you see the hand of God moving there, then joining the church is an affirmation of that belief.
- Third, joining the church allows you to fully participate and grow your spiritual and leadership gifts.
- Finally, by joining the church you are telling the world that you affirm what is happening there are glad to be a part of the ministry.

You can still attend worship, go to Bible studies, volunteer to help with projects, go on mission trips. and give financially without joining the church. Everyone is welcome here. Joining simply tells the world that you want to be a part of God's lifechanging mission in and through the local church. It says a lot in this day and age where people are reluctant to make a commitment to anything.

No church is perfect. Churches, as a rule, are made up of imperfect people. As the Apostle Paul says, "All have sinned..." Yet, we are a confessing to the world that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. Together, we look to grow in our faith. We gather to worship and praise God, to encourage each other, and as iron sharpens iron, help each other grow fully into the image of Christ. As CBC closes out the 2023 financial year the net income resulted in a deficit that was more than what was in the annual plan. This deficit was a combination of (3.2%) in reduced income and (6.8%) in additional expenses, as well as leaving nearly \$40,000 that allocated to the spending plan in the Trust fund account. A complete review of the 2023 spending plan was used to inform the 2024 spending plan. The generous donations and faithful support of members and friends allows Central Baptist to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!

The Persecuted Church

SNAPSHOTS OF PERSECUTION, 2023-24



NICARAGUA: Authorities have detained at least 14 priests, one bishop, and two seminarians since late last month in the country's most recent crackdown on the Roman Catholic Church. It is not clear what their alleged crimes are, although authorities arrested Bishop Isidoro del Carmen Mora Ortega on Dec. 20 after he expressed solidarity with Bishop Rolando Álvarez during a church service. Álvarez, a prominent critic of Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega, is serving a 26-year prison sentence for treason and other charges.

MAURITANIA: Officials in the Muslim-majority country released at least 15 Christian leaders and their family members by mid-December. They had been arrested weeks earlier after a leaked video showing a baptism ceremony circulated on social media. Christianity is not illegal in Mauritania, although the country's law prohibits citizens from leaving Islam and mandates the death penalty for violators.

NIGERIA: Christmas 2023 was one of the bloodiest in Plateau State, Nigeria as over 200 innocent civilians have been killed, with over 500 wounded and 1,000s displaced. These killings, being meted out by well-armed Fulani Islamic militants (aka: bandits) against rural Christian farmers remain a constant occurrence. In this one State (out of 36) there have been well over 600 deaths in 2023.



Black History Month

February is designated as Black History Month, people everywhere think first about the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Most people know that Dr. King was one of the most prominent Civil Rights Leader, but he was also an American Christian Minister, Activist and Political Philosopher. Dr. Martin Luther King advanced civil rights for people of color in the United States through the use of nonviolent resistance.

This always makes me reflect on my father's (Rev. Joshua A. McClure) oldest brother Edward McClure who also pursued a path of bringing people together through non-violent protest that targeted social change. My Uncle Eddie was a Community Relations Officer with the U.S. Department of Justice. He "creatively used his skills as a cultural analyst, negotiator and bridge builder during the 1970's & 1980's. At a point in his life he had the privilege of meeting Dr. King. They shared many meals, conversations and peaceful protests together.

In thinking about these two great men, my mind and heart goes into reflection about everything that transpired for them and how much they accomplished. It takes just one person to make a change, to make a difference, to become a part of the solution, not the problem. What can we do in this present day to continually learn as Black History is everyone's history? What can we do to "create an atmosphere of mutual respect and foster open and honest dialogues" with people who look, act and sound different from us?




