

PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

There is a saying, "Haste, makes waste." I experienced that reality this week. Our Bible study was scheduled to begin in twenty minutes. I was in a hurry. I wasn't thinking. I tried to take a short cut. All I got was a big mess. The whole event played out in slow motion in front of me. Coffee grounds went everywhere. Water splashed all over the counter and was flowing over the edge onto the floor like a waterfall. The simple task of making a pot of coffee had gone all wrong.



Things started well. I measured out the coffee and filled the cylinder with water. I was ready to hit the switch and watch the magic happen. That's when I noticed that the top flap of the coffee maker was under the cupboard laying back on itself. Without thinking I started to bend it forward to try to close it. It seemed simple enough but it caught on the bottom of the shelf above. I thought I could bend it enough to maneuver it and put it in place. As I did so, the whole coffee maker flipped over.

Have you had one of the moments where you wished you could have a "do over?" Too often, our poor decisions follow us and haunt us for the years to come. We make a mess of things and it leaves us feeling hopeless. The truth is that we rarely get second chances in life. Yet, at the heart of the gospel message is this idea that God offers all of us an opportunity to leave the past behind and begin again. They call it a mulligan in the game of golf.

There is a movie by that name, The Mulligan, that came out a few years ago. We meet a man named Paul McAlister in the film. Outwardly everything seems to be going well for him. He is a successful businessman and is well regarded by his peers. His personal life is a different story. He is separated from his wife and estranged from his son. He feels trapped and unable to fix it. That's when he meets an old golf pro played by Pat Boone.

The movie has been described as a parable of grace, forgiveness and restoration. It points to God's love and the way our faith in God opens the door for a second chance in life. We don't have to carry those mistakes from the past with us forever when we turn to him. If we repent, if we ask for God's forgiveness, we can put them behind us and begin again. That's what the cross is all about. Jesus suffered and died so that those who turn to him, can find forgiveness and new life.

I made a new pot of coffee after I cleaned up the mess. No one had a clue as to what had just happened just a few minutes earlier when people showed up for the Bible study. All they saw was a full carafe of the freshly brewed java. So it is with us when we put our faith in Christ. The Bible tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:12, "If anyone is in Christ he is a new creation. The old has passed away and all things are made new."

Are you looking for a mulligan? Are you looking to put your past behind you and start over? Invite Jesus to come into your life. Let him clean up your past mistakes and get ready to tee off on the fairway of life.

The mission board is pleased to bring you another update of missionaries that we support as a congregation. This month we received a letter from our long-time friend Mercy Barnes. Mercy wrote to thank us for our faithful support both in financial support and in prayer.



Her letter started with exciting family news as Mercy's family grew last year with the arrival of their first grandchild, Teddy. On March $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of this year, he will turn 1. Her adult children are living in Connecticut, Hawaii, and California.

Mercy's husband continues to serve as a chaplain with individuals that are in detention awaiting a resolution to their immigration status. This is an important ministry that lets them know that they are not alone regardless of their resolution and that God is with them.

Mercy continues to work with people that want to be better prepared to serve God through the process of education. She has traveled to Nicaragua and Brazil and began a group in the United States. The diversity of these groups is truly wonderful. The cohort in Brazil is composed of people from Brazil, Bolivia, Columbia, Chile, and Ecuador. The cohort in Nicaragua has people from Nicaragua, El Salvador, Mexico, and Cuba. The group from the United States is equally diverse with people originally from Columbia, Puerto Rico, Ecuador, and El Salvador. Mercy enjoys working with these missionaries as they learn and serve, she knows that God is doing great things through these faithful leaders. She also has had the opportunity to walk alongside leaders in the Dominican Republic and Haiti as she meets with them in leadership training retreats.

We will continue to support her work in serving the Lord and hope to schedule a visit with Mercy in the future.

Here's the thing...we've been given a beautiful gift, one we could never possibly repay. As scripture says, the ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough. There's a great example we can learn from in Isaiah 6, better known as Isaiah's commission. So begins the amazing journey of the prophet Isaiah.

This is how we are to respond to the love of God...the incredible gift of grace that is Jesus Christ. He is the burning coal touched to our lips that purifies us and allows us to stand in the presence of the eternal God! That amazing grace is all ours!!! And what's more? He's asking each of us to do something for him! How could we possibly withhold our love and obedience if we truly believe that we have been given the gift of eternal life? How can we say anything else but yes Lord!

Anne Frank, the young Jewish girl put to death by the Nazis, said many wise things in her diary. "No one," she wrote, "has ever become poor by giving." That may seem strange, but it is quite true. We actually find that we become rich when we give. Jesus himself said: "Give, and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap." (Luke 6:38) How can it be so?

First of all, God honors the good steward. God is not about to neglect a servant who uses his or her talents and resources in a wise and generous manner.

Secondly, the giver who gives freely soon finds that life takes on a joy not known before. He or she sees that the time, money, and effort given to do God's work brings incalculably rich rewards. One man started his habit of giving by slipping money into the coat pocket of a homeless man whom he heard ask a restaurant owner for a meal. The giver felt so good about his secret gift that throughout the years he responded positively to many people and causes in need of a helping hand. He says that he has had many rich experiences. He also says that each year income seems to increase, thus giving him more with which to make the world a better place.

Thirdly, those who discover the joy of giving freely also learn that they become richer in their knowledge of how to get the most from their time, talent, energy, and income.

Lastly, the good steward has the satisfaction of knowing that he or she is becoming what Jesus called "rich toward God." (Luke 12:21)

He pieced together what he recalls about Jesus' boyhood, ministry, and trial. Pontius Pilate's point of view is very different from the followers of Jesus. This book is a great read and a very clever novel.




If you have been thinking about taking the next step in your faith journey, speak to Pastor Cal. We will be hosting a baptism and welcome of new members in late March.



Meaning of Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a Christian holy day of prayer, fasting, and repentance. It marks the beginning of Lent, a season of 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter Sunday. The observance of Ash Wednesday is most common in the West-

observance of Ash Wednesday is most common in the Western Christian tradition, including Roman Catholicism, Anglicanism, and some Protestant denominations. The name "Ash Wednesday" is derived from placing ashes on believers' foreheads in the shape of a cross. The ashes are typically obtained by burning the palms blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday. The imposition of ashes is often accompanied by the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," emphasizing mortality and the need for repentance." By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return. (Genesis 3:19)

The Carpenter


