PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

I always like to take time to reflect on the past year between Christmas and New Year's Day. At first glance, it seemed like 2023 was just an average year in the life of our church. Life was getting back to normal after three years of a pandemic frenzy. As I dove a little deeper, looking to pull out the highlights, I came up with a list that was quite impressive. It wasn't easy but I whittled the list down to my top ten events of the year. First up though, are the honorable mentions that didn't make the list. Each of them, in and of themselves provided great moments; yet they could be considered a highlight in almost every year.



The honorable mentions include; The Mother Daughter Banquet with guests from the Granite Theater's production of the Lion King Jr. The First Responders Celebration co-hosted by us and St. Pius X Church. The mission trip to Kentucky. Stellar Vacation Bible School. Laity Sunday with a terrific message by Scott Gail. The Women's Retreat at Camp Canonicus. On any given year, all of these would have easily made the top ten. That is just how special 2023 was.

My Top Ten

- 10. <u>The SING! Conference</u>... Thirteen members of the church attended the Sing! music and worship conference in Nashville, TN. I believe the conference will have ripple effects in our congregation in the years to come. The event brought together six to seven thousand Christians to learn more about how our hymns speak to our faith.
- 9. <u>A rejuvenated Men's Ministry</u>... Back in March we sent eight men to the Iron Sharpens Iron Men's Conference in Connecticut. The men continue to meet for monthly breakfasts but have also launched a men's ministry that has averaged just over twenty for their first few meetings and promises to do great things.
- 8. Our Father's Day Car Show... The show continues to grow. This year we brought in 106 cars and the crowd was the largest ever. Designed as an outreach event, several of our members greeted the guests and shared Christian hospitality. So many reported that ours is a show that truly touches hearts.
- 7. <u>The Christmas Bazaar</u>... Chairs Meredith Eckel and Pat Collins reported that this was the most successful (financially) bazaar that we've ever had. People were in and out all day and the luncheon was a sellout. We welcomed the community and introduced ourselves. Almost everyone left with a smile on their face.
- 6. <u>Dedication of the Memorial Garden</u>... It took three years of planning and development, and when we dedicated the Memorial Garden in June, we were all able to celebrate its beauty. We recognized John Macomber during the dedication ceremony for it was his idea. A special thank you was offered to all who helped make it happen.
- 5. Our Holy Week & Easter Worship Celebrations... Beginning with the Palm Sunday worship service and the five baptisms, each of the worship services that followed were meaningful and added to our celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. Wednesday night, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the three Easter morning worship services put our focus right where it belonged—on the love of Christ for each and every one of us.
- 4. Young Adult Group growth... Out of the group Steve Burnside founded, Jon Humphrey, Paul Georgetti and Riley Burnside were baptized and began taking active roles in the church and in the group. Today the group regularly has thirteen or fourteen young adults meeting every week. Six of them will be baptized in January of 2024.
- 3. Christmas Eve Triple Header... We had almost three hundred people in attendance for our Christmas Services this year. We held them at 120:30 am, 7:00 pm and at 11:30 pm. Beautiful music and inspiring messages made each one special for those who came to hear the most wonderful story about God's greatest gift.
- 2. White Gift Sunday... This service ranks among the top events each year because of the simplicity and amazing generosity of our congregation. Over 160 gifts and \$600 in cash were given to be distributed to area helping agencies.
- 1. The Call of our Associate Pastor... Pastor Enrique has coordinated the formation of the Anchor Youth Group and Anchor Praise Band. He has encouraged the activation of a formal men's ministry, and he helped me to organize the evaluation teams for each of our ministries. Since joining us in June, Enrique, Brigid and their three girls have been a blessing to our ministry.

During the month of November planned giving fell behind amounts projected in the annual spending plan while the majority of annual spending has been completed. The planned withdrawals from the unrestricted endowment is approximately \$15,000 below planned amounts so this combined with declines in planned giving explain the difference between the YTD Net Income and the Net Income in the YTD spending plan. As CBC closes out the 2023 financial year the Net Income should more closely align with the annual spending plan. The generous donations and faithful support of members and friends allows Central Baptist to serve our community. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!

Board of Missions

As we look forward to a new year, we look back at the work of God by some of our missionaries and organizations that we as a congregation support throughout the year.

In December we received an update from Jeni Pedzinski. She continues to settle into her new role as Director of Mission Mobilization at International Ministries which she started about a year ago. In this role she supports those being called to global service by helping them make life changing decisions and mentoring them as they answer the call to service. She has also been helping to take care of her father who had a stroke last year, traveling back home to help her mother when she is needed.

Chikumbuso, a grassroots nonprofit organization in Ng'ombe, Zambia providing opportunities to transform women and children living in poverty by building long term resilience through education, micro-enterprise, skills training, and asset-building programs in the community, sponsored over 800 students in K-12 and 88 were sponsored to attend college in 2023. Each day they served 400 lunches in the school and 250+ students trained in their sewing program to enable them to make a living using their sewing skills. May God bless the work of all our missionary partners and all of us as we serve him and share his love and word with others in this New Year.

Have you ever heard of the Roman Road to Salvation? It's kind of a roadmap we Christians can use to share our faith. In Paul's letter to the Romans, he wrote several verses that explain the Gospel story simply and concisely. Here are five that explain why a person needs a savior.

First, people are a **Problem.** Romans 3:10 says, "As it is written: there is no one righteous, not even one." And Romans 6:23a says, "For the wages of sin is death."

But, humanity's **Hope is in Christ.** Romans 6:23b says, "But the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus, our Lord." Now, that is good news!

As Sinners we need to **Respond.** In Romans 10:9-10, Paul says, "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." Now, that is worth sharing.

And finally, the best part of the Gospel story is the **Result of Salvation**. Paul said, "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand." (Romans 5:1-2). I may not be good at memorizing Scripture, but I can remember problem, hope, response, and result.

Pastor Enrique Newman will be leading a mission team from New England to Honduras from January 13 - 20. Brian Gerbutavich and Skip Terwilliger will be joining them as they head to Honduras to work on a building project.

The primary focus of their work will be the expansion of the dining hall at the camp where hundreds of children go each year. The El Arca Camp is a unique center that was founded to provide a safe and nurturing environment for children and teens who have had a difficult start in life.



Many of these young people have experienced neglect, abuse, or poverty, and lack the resources and support needed to thrive. The El Arca Camp staff believes that every child deserves a chance to succeed, and they are dedicated to providing them with the tools and skills they need to build a successful future. Located on 33 acres of picturesque woodland, El Arca Camp offers a wide range of educational and recreational opportunities for our campers. If you are wondering, El Arca is about 45 miles east of the capital city of Tegucigalpa.

Please pray for the team as they go out on mission on behalf of all of us here at home.

Who Was Martin Luther King Jr? (1929-1968)

Martin Luther King Jr. was a Baptist minister and civil-rights activist who had a seismic impact on race relations in the United States, beginning in the mid-1950s. Among his many efforts, King headed the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). Through his activism and inspirational speeches, he played a pivotal role in ending the legal segregation of African American citizens in the United States, as well as the creation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. King won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, among several other honors. He continues to be remembered as one of the most influential and inspirational African American leaders in history. In 1948, King earned a sociology degree from Morehouse College and attended the liberal Crozer Theological Seminary in Chester, Pennsylvania. He thrived in all his studies, and was valedictorian of his class in 1951, and elected student body president. He also earned a fellowship for graduate study.
