

PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

There is so much to be excited about as we come back to worship this fall. There has been a lot of talk about a few additions to the physical plant at church this summer. You can't miss seeing what has been done out back. We've enlarged the playground area and added Noah's Ark to the configuration. The kids at Vacation Bible School were so excited to play on it and I'm sure our Nursery School students will truly appreciate it as well.

The Memorial Prayer Garden has really taken shape. The trees have been planted, the path laid and the pergola and fencing installed. Soon the memorial bricks will be laid. It is going to be a special place to come and pray. The amazing thing about these additions, and a few future planned repairs and upgrades, is the fact that we haven't had to use any money from our Spending Plan. The financing has come from outside donations or designated funds which allows us to spend the pledged dollars for ministry.

For example, we have totally revamped our Christian Education Plan for our children. We have invested in a Children's Church program which the kids will truly enjoy. We have teamed up with Group Publishing to purchase a weekly VBS type curriculum. It features the same fun kid videos that our children have come to love. Bible story time brings the Bible to life for the kids. Our craft time has been upgraded as well. We have a team of 15 church volunteers working the program right now. We believe that providing a good platform of Christian education for our kids is vital to their growth and it is our job to make it a priority.

I am excited to report that the Holy Spirit has also been at work as two new groups are emerging to meet the spiritual needs of our congregation. A young adult group has been formed and is planning to meet to brainstorm opportunities to reach out to others in their age group. They are excited to try new things and plan activities that will foster growth and new connections. A second group has come together that is bringing recent widows and widowers out for conversation and fellowship. It has been a blessing and enriches the ministry that we share with one another.

We said good-bye to our youth leader, Ben Geer, last month as enthusiasm had waned among our teens. We are planning a fresh start next month. An outing to Six Flags is being planned for Saturday, October 29th. This is being planned for our teens but all are welcome to join us. The cost is \$25.00 per person. There is a sign up at church. Going forward there will be a special gathering planned once a month. I will be looking for a few chaperones to help with the gatherings.

Finally, I am very excited to announce that the Church Council, and all four of our Church Boards have given preliminary approval to the search for an Associate Pastor in 2023. You will be hearing more about it at our October business meeting. This dream has been made possible because of your generous giving over the last few years. The Trustees believe that we can support the position through our spending plan. The responsibilities of this person will include assisting me in worship leadership and pastoral care, visitation and assisting in ministry to youth and families. He or she will be asked to develop multi-level programming for youth and adult ministries. We will be asking this person to develop relationships with area schools and work with area youth in completion of senior projects, music programs and other areas of interest. If you have questions or thoughts about this, please speak to members of the feasibility subcommittee which includes Meredith Eckel, Cathy Burnside, Fritz Eckel and me.

As we emerge from the Pandemic and look to the future, I believe God has good things in store for us. If God has put a dream or vision for ministry in your heart, come talk to me. Let's see if we can move on it and make ministry happen.

The Memorial Garden continues to make progress. Our first order for Memorial Bricks has been placed. The fence and pergola have been installed. Most of the Arborvitae trees and Barberry bushes have been planted.

We will soon begin the first phase of replacing the flooring on the south wing of the church, starting on the top floor.

The Nursery School expansion of the fencing has been completed.

We are still looking for someone with experience in designing commercial kitchens to review our kitchen and make recommendations for improvement of safety and function.

The roof gutter on the north side of the church has a rotted area and will be inspected by Eagle Restoration during the annual inspection of the roof.

Income, expenses, and planned amounts for Avondale Chapel and the Nursery School have been included in the totals. Giving last month had a slight drop, but expenses were less than planned and offset half of the planned deficit. The year-to-date numbers continue to be strong, with a 57K surplus. Your continued generous donations and faithful support allows Central Baptist to serve our members and community. Thank you so much!

Vietnam

The Persecuted Church



As we all know, Vietnam is a communist country and, as such, does not look kindly upon Christian witness there. They do tolerate Christian churches from established denominations such as Roman Catholics and even Baptists in their cities but Evangelical ministries can come under pressure from Government agencies. Vietnam ranks number 19 on the World Watch List, but most active persecution is directed against Christians living in the rural areas of the country and comes from those who adhere to the local indigenous religions even though the largest number of Christians belong to the tribal people such as the Hmong.

Most persecution is similar to what happened to four families comprising 32 members who were forced out of their home village for refusing to reconvert to the local animist religion. They became Christians in 2017 after listening to Christian radio broadcasts, so there is no local Christian community for support. The families have been allowed to return but have missed the rice planting season which means they are without enough food to sustain them until the next harvest. Prior to their eviction from the village they had been subjected to severe harassment, including the theft of their livestock, interruption of electricity supplies and a newborn child was denied a birth certificate which is required for health care and education.

Since returning they are under close surveillance and their movements are closely monitored by the local government.

Such persecution is not uncommon in much of the Asian and SE Asian countries and to serve Christ faithfully requires a total commitment. We should always be grateful for the freedom we enjoy to follow Christ and always remember those less fortunate in our daily prayers.

Stewardship Moment

USE YOUR TALENT TO GOD'S GLORY

Have you heard about the school for animals that was set up in this forest? All the animals decided it was time to set some criteria for who should be allowed to live in the forest, so a number of them came up with a curriculum that included tree climbing, swimming, flying, and running. They decided all animals must pass each of these classes in order to graduate.



Well, the first class was in tree climbing, which of course the squirrels passed with flying colors. The fleet-footed deer, however, flunked the course. When it came to running, the deer got straight A's; but the geese kept falling over frontwards. God's idea of talents, however, is based on their usefulness to others, not on the number of talents, nor how artistic they are. Not only will we be held accountable for using the talent we have been given; but as importantly, whether we have used it in God's kingdom.


I said a prayer for you today and I know God must've heard,






