



The Board of Trustees has made a change on our custodial services at church. We have contracted with Partners in Grime to do the weekly church cleaning going forward. They will come twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays to thoroughly clean the church. This means that each of us who use the church for events and meetings will be responsible for setting up tables and chairs, picking up after your gathering or meeting, and putting anything you use during the event back to the way it was when you arrived. Please pick up your trash and place it in the new trash containers located on each floor by the men's and women's rest rooms.

If you need a set up for your event or gathering, please pick up a form in the church office and submit it a few days ahead of your event or meeting. The Property Team can assist you with your set-up. The team has a labeled box in the outer office for you to submit your form once completed.

Deb Peterson remains as our Sunday Morning Custodian. She is responsible for opening up the church, turning on the lights, opening the doors, ensuring that the heat is on and all areas are prepared for use. She is also responsible for cleaning all areas that have been used on Sunday morning, turning off the lights, turning down the heat and closing up after service has ended.

Tia Burgess is our Nursery School custodian and she is responsible for cleaning the areas within the walls of our Nursery School.

PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

It appears that we are making up for the mild winters we've enjoyed the last few years. It snowed in December to knock out our White Gift Celebration. It has now snowed for two weeks in January and there is the threat of another storm the last weekend of the month as I write this. A few weeks back I said that I wouldn't be inclined to cancel church unless we had a blizzard or severe ice storm. Then God dropped 14 inches on us. We still had church and 31 hearty souls came out to worship. But here is the point. I will always be here. I can walk. The doors will be open if you need to be here on a Sunday morning. We will offer some type of live service. But, your safety is always my first priority. Don't be a hero. Now that we can broadcast the services on Facebook live and YouTube, you can still worship from the security of your home during inclement weather. Come when the weather is good. Stay safe when it isn't. I will try to send an email to alert you on what's happening. We will post it on our website and have it on the answering machine. If it is snowing in the morning, we will probably cancel the Adult Bible Study and Kids Church. As they say in the fire service, if you decide to come out, proceed under caution.



I want to make you aware of a few new offerings this winter/spring. On Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm we are hosting "Sermon Talkback!" It is your opportunity to ask questions and to go a little deeper into the topic of the previous Sunday's sermon. Actually, you can bring any questions you have about Scripture, our sermons and church life to the group. We had ten people at our initial session as we discussed the nature of God. In coming weeks we will be discussing several other Basic Christian doctrines including the doctrine of Christ, the Holy Spirit, the nature of Man, the destructive nature of sin and the power of repentance and forgiveness, the work of the church, the role of Scripture and the end times. Come when you can and let's learn from one another.

The second offering to note is the return of Anchor Church. During the Lenten season we will be offering a shorter, contemporary worship service on Sunday evenings at 6:00 pm. This will begin on Sunday, February 22nd through Palm Sunday, March 29th. We hope some of you will take advantage of these services and invite a friend who may not be attending worship service already.

The planning for a short term mission trip in 2026 is just getting underway. If you are interested or have thoughts where we might go, to serve this year, please speak to Pastor Cal, Noreen Gerrish, Janet Gerbutavich or Carol Arnold. As we make plans, we have already scheduled our first fundraiser, the Soup-er Bowl Sunday Sale on February 8th.

Finally, we are proceeding with plans for the ordination of Pastor Enrique Newman. Last Fall he finished his Master's Degree in Ministry from Liberty University. Now we are working with ABCORI's Standing Committee on Ministry to move towards an ordination council and eventually an Ordination Service. Please pray for him as we go through this process. It is an exciting time for all of us.



Sensitivity is Key



There is a tremendous difference between being sensitive and being overly sensitive. Part of the Christian life is making an effort to understand those around us. Each person's uniqueness reflects God's creativity in forming them. There should be no expectation that we are all alike or even think alike. Not even when you may both claim to be followers of Jesus.

Jesus had diverse experiences in his life. He encountered many in his inner and outer circles at different stages of their lives, with varied perspectives and approaches. Jesus always demonstrated sensitivity through compassion.

Every person carries a unique set of experiences and attitudes. We are not the center of the universe, Jesus is. Therefore, merging both can be complicated, but it helps respect the distinctness of each individual we encounter.

Application: Remember that the unifying element in humanity's diversity is Jesus and his work at the cross. When a Christian is sensitive to God, they become more aware and understanding of others.

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - Jews or Greeks, slaves or free - and all were made to drink of one Spirit." **Corinthians 12:12-14 (ESV)**

Question: Have I been sensitive to the Holy Spirit? Or have I been overly sensitive to the flesh?

Call to Action: When the Holy Spirit tugs at you, pay attention. When he leads, follow His guidance. When He commands, obey without hesitation.

The 2025 financial plan was executed as planned. Comparing year-to-date revenues and expenditures to planned amounts 93.0% of planned revenues have been received and 98.2% of planned expenditures have been executed. Regular giving year-to-date totals \$244,529.00 representing an increase of 4.6% when compared to last year planned giving. At the end of the year 72% of funds planned to be drawn from the endowment have been utilized, leaving \$31,700.00 in the endowment providing access to additional revenue if it is necessary. End of Year Expenditures were less than this years planned amounts.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so very much!

Memorial Opportunities

In recent years we have hosted several outdoor events in our back parking lot. Our volunteers have rolled out tables and chairs, set up the grills and designated a space for the event. As our crew has gotten older, it has become increasingly challenging to do so. Two years ago the idea arose of erecting a permanent pavilion that would be suitable for these events. The total cost has been estimated at 100,000. This space could be utilized for these events and so many more outdoor opportunities for our church family. It is a big ask but we've already received over \$12,000 in donations toward the project. Small Group Studies at Central this Winter




Sunday Mornings at 9:00 am

Led by Nancy Balentine.




Wednesday Night at 7:00 pm - Sermon Talkback!







America for Christ



The earlier you begin bringing your children to church ,the more accustomed they will be to coming. It will become a natural environment for them and the people will become like extended family.



Believer's Baptisms at Central

What is Christian Baptism? It is the means by which a person makes a public profession of faith and commits to discipleship. In the waters of baptism, a person says, "I confess my faith in Christ; Jesus has cleansed my soul from sin, and I now have a new life in him." Believer's baptism illustrates, in dramatic style, the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. At the same time, it also illustrates our death to sin and our new life in Christ. As the person confesses the Lord Jesus, he dies to sin ([Romans 6:11](#)) and is raised to a brand-new life ([Colossians 2:12](#)).

Being submerged in the water represents death to sin, and emerging from the water represents the cleansed, holy life that follows salvation. ([Romans 6:4](#)) puts it this way: "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Very simply, water baptism is an outward testimony of the inward change in a believer's life. Family Dedications at Central Baptist

A family dedication is a ceremony in which believing parents, and sometimes entire families, make a commitment before the Lord to raise that child according to God's Word and God's ways. At the same time, the congregation promises to encourage and support the family as they fulfill their promise. Many Christian churches practice baby dedication instead of infant baptism (also known as *Christening*) as their primary celebration of a child's birth into the community of faith. Christian Weddings at Central and at the Avondale Chapel

The essence of a traditional Christian marriage is a covenantal commitment between two people, a man and a woman, that is founded in God's love. The wedding is the ceremony in which two people publicly unite as husband and wife in the presence of God and their family and friends. The pastor is an official representative of the church and gives his blessing to the union. The gathered family and friends join in affirming the marriage through their presence, their prayers, and their blessing. At both Central and Avondale, our pastors have the liberty to perform weddings for any couple, even non-members, who would like to have God's blessing on their marriage. They also have the right to turn down wedding requests for those that they feel are not looking for God's blessing or are not committed to Christ and each other.






Library Corner & Library Room




The Library Corner bookcase is located in the back of Fellowship Hall.

Substitute Church Bus Drivers






Human Resource Team

From Our Tax Advisor

The legislation that was passed on July 4, 2025, creates a permanent, above-the-line, deduction for charitable donations of \$1,000 per single tax filer and \$2,000 per couple who file jointly.

This is for non-itemizers, taxpayers who use the standard deduction, and it starts in 2026. This provides tax benefits to a large number of taxpayers who donate but do not itemize, since about 90% of taxpayers take the standard deduction. A similar policy was temporarily available in 2020 – 2021 during the pandemic when non-itemizers had a \$300 deduction per filer (joint filers had a \$600 deduction for 2021).

The OBBBA is permanent. This new deduction means that if you don't itemize you have a way to reduce your tax bill. To illustrate, a non-itemizer single filer in the 12% marginal tax bracket will have a \$120 tax reduction for a \$1,000 cash donation and a couple will have a \$240 tax reduction for a \$2,000 cash donation. For those in the 22% marginal tax bracket, the non-itemizer single filer will see a \$220 tax reduction for a \$1,000 donation and a couple a \$440 tax reduction for a \$2,000 donation.





