



Over the years, I have received many wonderful gifts from family and loved ones. The ones that stood out the most were the personalized gifts, the ones given with deep thought. The time invested in choosing them meant the world to me.

However, the more meaningful question should be this. What is the best gift YOU have ever GIVEN? There is something about giving that elevates the experience more than receiving. The thought and

preparation that go into choosing a gift are fascinating. Followed by the act of giving the gift. Finally, there is the excitement and expectation of seeing the reaction of the one receiving it.

It takes a lot to be generous. A lot of love. A lot of selflessness. A lot of joy. To be truly generous is to reflect the very heart of who God is in us. Someone recently asked whether we need to have material wealth saved in order to be generous, arguing that generosity requires first accumulating wealth. The answer is no. We give because it is born from the heart. It's a heart that blesses and seeks to please. Generosity begins even before a physical gift is given. It is born out of love, not out of the overabundance of a bank account.

Generosity takes practice. It's a solemn act in which you give from the many blessings that God has given you. Well, you might argue, God has everything. What could I possibly give Him? Give Him everything. All of you, especially your finances.

Application: Our generosity needs to be vertical and horizontal. Vertical because we first recognize the one who has gifted us everything. Our first and best gifts should always go to God. Horizontal because in the same sense, we are to emulate God's kindness towards others. "A generous person will be enriched and the one who waters will himself be watered." Proverbs 11:25 (ESV)

Question: What will be your BEST gift to God this Christmas?

From the Board of Deacons:

The "Sears Wish Book" was a popular Christmas-themed catalog released annually by the department store chain Sears, Roebuck & Company. The catalog contained toys and other holiday-related merchandise. For decades children of all ages eagerly waited for "The Wish Book" to arrive in their mailboxes. As they carefully studied every page, they circled those gifts they hoped to find under the tree on Christmas morning. Gift giving is a universal expression of love, gratitude, and connection in all cultures. In Genesis 4:4 we read, "and Abel brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering." This is one of the earliest records of gift-giving recorded in the Bible. Abel offered God the best he had, and it reveals His heart attitude and his desire to honor God. Centuries later God would give the world His best when Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem. The Bible highlights various forms of giving and serving but one of the most memorable is found in Luke 21:1-4. "And He (Jesus) looked up and saw the rich men casting their gifts in the treasury. And He saw also a certain widow casting in two mites." Jesus observes the wealthy making large offerings from their abundance, but it is the widow's offering that catches His attention – two small coins of seemingly insignificant value. This act of giving, although modest, represented all she had. Her offering was a demonstration of trust, and a willingness to give not out of her surplus but out of her poverty. This story shifts the focus from the quantity of the gift to the quality of the giver's heart. It is the sacrifice behind the gift that holds greater value than the gift itself. As you give gifts during this Christmas season, may every gift you give be a true reflection of what is in your heart.

The 2025 financial plan continues to be slightly behind planned amounts as of October 31, 2025. Comparing year-to-date revenues and expenditures to planned amounts, 75.4% of planned revenues have been received and 79.8% of planned expenditures have been executed. Regular giving year-to-date totals \$199,366.20 representing an increase of 2.9% when compared to the same time last year. Year-to-date expenditures are tracking less than this year's planned amounts.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!

You can give either directly from your bank account or... (for a higher fee) use a debit/credit card. The app uses the same security as bank web sites, so your personal information is secure. Also, it allows you to schedule your donations in advance, so "once and it's done."



Persecuted Church



Christmas 2025 ~ As we celebrate this special time of year with family get togethers, parties and gift giving we also keep our focus on the reason for the season, our savior Jesus Christ.



Let us keep in mind those in the Christian family whose devotion to their savior has resulted in the loss of all the family focused celebrations. I am referring to all those who are going to spend this Christmas in prison for the sake of the gospel. These days this is not an insignificant number. Although accurate numbers are impossible to obtain because of the lack of transparency from the governments concerned, the following are some examples of the size of this incarceration.

In Pakistan more than 700; in India more than 500; in Eritrea more than 350; in Iran more than 100; in North Korea multiple thousands in labor camps; in China an unknown number in the hundreds.

These are some of the countries imprisoning Christians for their faith. Many more are in other, mainly Muslim or communist countries.

Please remember to pray for these unnamed brothers and sisters in prison and their families on the outside who must survive, many times without their primary breadwinner, at this special time of year.

Scripture Memorization Changed My Life

My life was dramatically transformed when, as a 17-year-old young man, I came to know Christ as my own personal Lord and Savior. It was several weeks after that crisis moment before I ever remember hearing the word *repentance*. But I know I repented on that cold January day as a senior in high school because I immediately, instantaneously, started hating what I used to love and loving what I used to hate.



Places I had formerly gone on Friday nights held zero attraction for me anymore. And things I never thought I would enjoy, like reading the Bible and spending time with other believers, is where I began to find my greatest joy. Even though I grew up in a moral home with wonderful and nurturing parents, we were not church people. I had never heard a prayer in my home or seen the Bible opened in my home before my conversion experience. In fact, I was just a few months away from attending the university and did not know that Matthew, Mark, Luke or John were books of the Bible.

On that first Sunday morning of my conversion experience, someone handed me a paper with 1 Cor. 10:13 written on it, saying something to the effect that I should memorize it because I was going to need it along the way of my new faith journey. To me it looked like some type of hieroglyphic symbolism.

The next day after school, I drove downtown where I had seen a Christian bookstore, and I purchased my first Bible. Back in my car I pulled out that piece of paper. I noted in the front of my new Bible a table of contents with abbreviations for the names of the books. My eyes fell on "Cor" and I quickly turned to the page number listed and discovered it stood for Corinthians. I figured out that the "10" represented the chapter and the "13" was obviously the verse.

And there it was, the first verse I ever read- "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it" (NKJV). Sitting there in my car, mesmerized by that truth, I memorized it on the spot and thus began a journey of Scripture memory that has buried multiplied hundreds of verses in my heart and mind and served me across all these decades since. Only the Lord knows how many times I have arrived at temptation's corner, and that one verse initially hidden in my heart came out of my mouth and kept me on the right path before I made a wrong turn.

Scripture memorization has enabled me to take the Word of God with me anywhere and everywhere without always having my Bible with me. It has enabled me across all these decades to receive the Word into my heart, retain it in my mind and recite it with my mouth in all types of circumstances and situations.

This is exactly what the Lord Jesus did during those days of temptation in the wilderness of Judea as he burst forth from the obscurity of the carpenter's shop and began His earthly ministry. With each temptation recorded in Matthew 4 that Satan brought the Lord's way, Jesus answered saying, "It is written..." The Word of God received and retained in our own hearts and minds enables us, like our Lord Himself, to overcome our own temptations when the words are spoken from memory through our mouths.

For me personally, Scripture memorization has been a never-ending life discipline. When memorizing Scripture, I have found it helpful to write it out in my own handwriting, phrase by phrase, on a small note card. I then keep the card in my pocket throughout the next few days. Then, numerous times, whether at my desk, in my car at a stop light, or on other such occasions, I simply review it until the first phrase is memorized and then the next and so on. Finally, I often quote it to myself a hundred times until it becomes sealed forever in my heart.

To me it is a strange thing that many believers who once memorized Scripture now, for one reason or another, have not memorized a single verse in years. The discipline of Scripture memory should be a sustained, lifelong pursuit. Even now I sit at my desk and type these words, I see before me on a card a Scripture I am putting to memory; "Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is his glory to overlook an offense" (Proverbs 19:11, ESV). I feel certain this verse will surface in my mind in times to come when I am tempted to harbor resentment and hold offenses. Yes, as the psalmist of old once said, "Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You" (Psalm 119:11, NKJV).

If it only takes a spark to get a fire going, it only takes one verse memorized and hidden in your heart to get a journey of Scriptures memorization going. Scripture memory will change your life... forever!

Candles That Tell a Story



Lighting its candles each Sunday is a treasured tradition during the four weeks of Advent. Depending on denomination, churches use different color combinations for the candles. Some place four blue candles around the wreath with a white one in the center, while others use all white. Many light purple candles on the first two Sundays, pink on the third, purple again on the fourth, and then a large white candle on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

Each part of the wreath carries symbolic meaning:

- The wreath: Its circular shape represents the everlasting love of God, having no beginning or end. The green symbolizes eternal life.
- **The four candles**: Mark the four weeks of Advent. One tradition says that each candle also represents 1,000 years, totaling 4,000 years from Adam and Eve to Christ's birth.
- **Purple candles**: in ancient times, was expensive and was considered the color of royalty and kings. On Christmas, Christ is proclaimed King of Kings. Purple also symbolizes humility and penitence. The first purple candle represents Hope; the second, Peace; and the final purple candle, Love.
- **Blue candles**: Blue is another color often used as a symbol of royalty. Some churches use blue candles to symbolize the night sky and the anticipation of the announcement of Christ's birth. Blue also symbolizes the beginning of a new creation as in the waters of Genesis 1.
- The Pink candle: Lit on the third Sunday, it represents Joy and marks the halfway point of Advent.
- The White candle: The large white candle in the center is the Christ candle. Its light symbolizes Christ the Savior "the light of the world."

The beauty and brightness from the glow of all five candles is a reminder that Christ's life was the light for all earth's people - "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5, NRSV).

The Advent wreath is more than just greenery and candles-it's a symbol of watchfulness and growing joy as Christmas draws near.





reach our goal for new robes. Hopefully soon we will have them ordered so we can dedicate them to the Lord.


Weekly Offering Envelopes





From Our Tax Advisor

The legislation that was passed on July 4, 2025, creates a permanent, above-the-line, deduction for charitable donations of \$1,000 per single tax filer and \$2,000 per couple who file jointly.

This is for non-itemizers, taxpayers who use the standard deduction, and it starts in 2026. This provides tax benefits to a large number of taxpayers who donate but do not itemize, since about 90% of taxpayers take the standard deduction. A similar policy was temporarily available in 2020 – 2021 during the pandemic when non-itemizers had a \$300 deduction per filer (joint filers had a \$600 deduction for 2021).

The OBBBA is permanent. This new deduction means that if you don't itemize you have a way to reduce your tax bill. To illustrate, a non-itemizer single filer in the 12% marginal tax bracket will have a \$120 tax reduction for a \$1,000 cash donation and a couple will have a \$240 tax reduction for a \$2,000 cash donation. For those in the 22% marginal tax bracket, the non-itemizer single filer will see a \$220 tax reduction for a \$1,000 donation and a couple a \$440 tax reduction for a \$2,000 donation.



Good will. God's good will toward us is a gift that transforms our lives. Through Jesus, God invites us out of selfishness and sin into a life marked by love, kindness, and community.

The angels' song wasn't meant only for shepherds long ago. It still sings to us today, calling each of us to live in glory, peace, and good will.




