






Overall, the financial picture is very positive with year-to-date revenue ahead of the year-to-date expenses. At the end of September, the year-to-date revenue was essentially equal to the planned giving amount. Overall Year-to-Date expenses through the end of September are tracking 6.5% lower than the year-to-date financial plan.

When reviewing planned major revenue line items, planned giving is on target to meet the \$230,000 forecasted amount. Withdrawals from trust funds and prior year funding accounts are being used at a slightly slower rate than planned.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!

You can give either directly from your bank account or ... (for a higher fee) use a debit/credit card.

The app uses the same security as bank web sites, so your personal information is secure.

Also, it allows you to schedule your donations in advance, so 'once and it's done'!

We hope that you will add a gift or two from our White Gift Christmas Tree to your list this year to help those in need in our community this coming holiday season.



What is White Gift Sunday? White Gift Sunday has its origins in the Methodist Church in Ohio when in 1904 a minister's wife and her daughters decided to give gifts wrapped in white paper at Christmas time to people in need. Gifts are wrapped in white so that they will be anonymous and so that people who can only give a little will not be embarrassed, every gift would look the same.

White Gift Sunday will take place on Sunday, December 8th, during our church service. Tags will be available on a Christmas tree in Fellowship Hall starting the weekend before Thanksgiving and will stay up till the weekend before White Gift Sunday. To participate, you take a tag or tags and purchase the items on the tags, or you can buy an item of your choice for a child. You will then wrap your gift in white paper and attach the tag to the gift. While physical gifts are preferred, monetary donations will be accepted as well.

This year our donations will benefit Stonington Human Services, the Westerly Police Department's Holiday Gift Program, and RICAN (Rhode Island Center Assisting Those in Need). If you have any questions, please reach out to a member of the mission board.



Persecuted Church

IDOP (International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church)

Around the world today, Christians in their own countries are often rejected for their faith. We can stand with persecuted Christians living in more than 70 nations around the world where it is difficult and dangerous to follow Christ. The forces that direct this persecution vary by country but it can be summed up under these three headings: Communist ideology; Radical Islam and culture driven.

Following are some brief examples supplied by Voice of the Martyrs ministry.

In India, pastors like Rajiv are falsely accused of forcing Hindus to convert to Christianity. This can result in costly legal proceedings for those ministering in urban settings like Rajiv, but for those ministering in remote villages it often results in physical assaults which occasionally are fatal.

In many parts of Africa, including Burkina Faso, Nigeria and the Democratic Republic of the Congo, churches and Christian villages are targeted by Islamists. Thousands of Christians like Yasmine, Sade and Gertrude are forced to flee their homes or be killed.

In Colombia, Marxist guerrillas and right-wing paramilitaries oppose bold believers like Edgar and Isabella, whose faithful witness for Christ has led to death threats against their family.

In China, church leaders like Wang Yi are imprisoned, sentenced by the Communist government to 9 years incarceration because they refuse to compromise the gospel amid the regime's demands and threats.

As our Christian brothers and sisters endure persecution for their faith, we can let them know they are cared for and loved by the global body of Christ by our prayerful support, encouraging them to stand firm.
