
PASTOR CAL'S CORNER


Dear Friends,

Comparing the financial plan to actuals after the first two months of the year reveals that revenue is tracking approximately 2.5% below the planned amount. This deficit is not concentrated in any one budget line item and may be attributed to timing of transactions. Expenses are below year-to-date planned amounts by 8.8%, but are greater than the year-to-date revenues. This \$4,583.02 deficit in year-to-date Net Ordinary Income can be attributed to budget line items relative to insurance costs and facility maintenance. These budget line items contribute to early year expenses due to timing. This actual deficit is less than half of the planned deficit of \$10,976.34. Overall, the two months of the new financial year are tracking as planned.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!



Anyone who may be thinking about possibly doing a Mission Trip within the states is invited to come to an informal talk and discussion about where we might want to go.






