



Dear Friends,

I was hoping that by the time we got to February 2022 we'd be running on all cylinders and have the green light to go full speed ahead. November and December were such great months. Attendance was at pre-Covid levels and we had several special events. Unfortunately, we hit a speed bump in January. The Omicron variant of the Coronavirus kicked up its ugly head and hit southern New England pretty hard. We all know someone who caught the virus. As a result, we decided to slow things down and put some safety measures back in place. I am hoping that soon, after you get this newsletter, we will be able to relax some of our protocols.

Despite this momentary setback, I believe 2022 is going to be a great year for all of us. Why not? Last year was a record setting year in so many ways. All I can say is "Thank you, Thank you, Thank you!" We've been able to forge ahead and try new things like the Parking Lot services and recapture some of the ministries that had been shut down. While many churches have gone backwards in all these areas, we actually grew. We welcomed new friends. We finished the year with a financial surplus, the first in many years. Your generosity and your enthusiasm has made it happen.

With that in mind, we are making plans for the future again. A new adult class will be meeting on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am this month. Sunday School classes for the children will begin again during the worship hour on Sunday, March 6th. Our coffee hours will return soon. We are planning a Lenten Bible study to begin in March and run through Easter. If all proceeds as planned, we will host Easter Services at Misquamicut Beach, at the Avondale Chapel and at Central this year. We started talking about bringing back the Mother Daughter Banquet in May and the Father's Day Car Show.

We are talking about a short-term mission trip again. Michelle Hallamore messaged me that God had put Kentucky on her heart and wondered if we could do something. They suffered a disastrous blow in the tornadoes that came across Western Kentucky. I put out the word and several people expressed interest. You will be hearing more in the coming weeks. Scott Gail wondered if there were any music and worship conferences being offered this year. As a result, a few of us are making plans to head to Nashville for the Sing! Conference in September. It is hosted by Keith and Krystin Getty and will include three days of deep theology, timeless artistry, and congregational singing focused on the power of prayer, the beauty of liturgy, and the vital role of the timeless confessions of the church for believers in all of life. Let me know if you want to hear more.

December's income is much higher than usual because of annual trust fund distributions and a year-end transfer to cover the steeple repair cost from prior year funds. Even so, we were blessed that the Planned Giving for 2021 exceeded our plan by almost \$26,000! Also, our expenses were almost \$50,000 less than planned, due to many programs being postponed. The net result is that the surplus was almost \$70,000 more than our plan. We will carry over the surplus to support programs and activities in 2022. Your continued generous donations and faithful support allows Central Baptist to serve our members and community. Thank you!

AMOS uses an empowering approach, following Christ’s example of listening to and healing the most vulnerable, engaging communities as full partners by training local Health Promoters. This program provides preventive and curative health services to remote communities with no doctors. Christy facilitates short-term mission opportunities, engages churches and individuals as partners in long-term ministry, and helps create multi-media content that helps share the stories of the people being touched by AMOS’s ministry. 2022 will be David Parajon’s final year serving as an IM missionary, and he has asked us to welcome Christy and support her on this journey to serve God and her neighbors in Nicaragua. We hope to meet Christy via a video call this year.


Save Lake Adams at Camp Canonicus

The Persecuted Church



Ministering to the persecuted church

We recognize that it is our responsibility to hold up our persecuted brothers and sisters throughout the world in our daily prayers and that God will minister to them in their trials, but how does the body of Christ actually minister to them to meet their needs?

There are a number of ministries that attempt to do that and we will look at some this month. The persecuted Church covets our prayers for we serve an all powerful God who has promised to meet our every need, but they have practical needs to be met. These needs vary depending on the situation in specific countries. Some have need of basic humanitarian supplies, food, clothing, shelter and medical help. These needs are often exacerbated by their rejection by the communities they live in and so ministries that support the persecuted church find that they have to include humanitarian relief as a part of their work. The two ministries that are at the forefront of ministry in this area, Voice of the Martyrs and Open Doors now find themselves increasingly incorporating this aspect of ministry into their work.

The traditional work that these ministries have been engaged in is supplying Bibles and other Christian literature, sometimes having to smuggle them in, but with the increase in availability of technology, Christian materials are available on the internet or other easily hidden technologies. The JesusFilm ministry of CRU (Campus Crusade for Christ) distributes their videos on the internet so they can be viewed on any smartphone and in countries where the internet is restricted Micro SD cards are used, which can be inserted into smartphones. Bibles can also be accessed in the same way and are distributed this way by many different ministries.

Radio has long been a means of getting the gospel and Bible teachings into closed nations. TRW (Trans World Radio) and FEBC (Far East Broadcasting Company) have for many years been broadcasting into China, Cuba and other communist nations where believers can listen on short wave radio. With the advent of satellite TV a ministry called SAT7 broadcasts into the Middle Eastern countries so their programming can be accessed from any satellite dish. They produce programs specifically for Iran and have many viewers there. The police regularly confiscate dishes in Iran but they are soon replaced by eager believers.

So the work of the gospel continues to advance even when the authorities attempt to destroy it. As Matthew 24:14 says “And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations.”
