Dear Friends,

It is so exciting to see so many coming back to church this fall. As we learn to live with the Coronavirus, we will continue to keep all of our safety protocols in place. Some activities are still on hold but we will slowly begin to engage in many of the old familiar ways.

It is so nice to have the choir back. As a singer, I am enjoying the comradery of those who come together to sing God's praises. As a worship leader, it is nice to have the group back serving alongside me on Sunday mornings. It feels good.

I am pleased with the return of our Sunday School. It has started slow but it is growing. I am thankful for our volunteers who have made the commitment to prepare each week. They are here for our families and are committed to teaching our children the basics of faith that will sustain them as they walk through life.

We have already had a few special celebrations this fall as we returned to worship. Our Rally Day and Back to Church Barbecue was fun. We got to enjoy a great cookout in the back. As we hosted the Annual Pastor's Appreciation Sunday we had our first quasi-fellowship hour in eighteen months. Karen Boeniger and the Board of Deacons set up a table in Fellowship Hall and people were encouraged to take a cupcake and say hello. I can't wait until we can make them a regular part of our weekly routine again. We hosted the outdoor part of the First Responders Celebration and enjoyed a concert by the Westerly Band and the St. Edmund's Pipes and Drum Band.

In November, we have a full complement of special services and celebrations planned. On November 7th we will kick off our Stewardship Campaign. The theme this year is "Faithful, Hopeful, Loving." You will hear more about it in the coming days. On November 14th we will commemorate the International Day of Prayer for Persecuted Churches with a time of remembrance. On November 21st we will witness a baptism as we celebrate the 75th Anniversary of our church. There will be some special moments during the service as well as several historical displays. That's Thanksgiving Sunday too so we will have the opportunity to reflect on the past year and give glory to God. On November 28th we will kick off the Advent season with a special guest speaker, Rev. Kathryn Palen. She is the Associate Executive Minister of ABCORI and a gifted speaker.

On Christmas Sunday (December 19th) there will be lots of singing as we celebrate the birth of our Savior. On Christmas Eve we will have two services. The family Candlelight service will be at 7:00 pm and we will have a special candlelight late night service at 11:30 pm.

The Automated External Defibrillator (AED) will be relocated near the Sanctuary. A second AED will be purchased and installed near Fellowship Hall. A second Grab and Go First Aid Bag will also be placed near Fellowship Hall.

The steeplejacks have completed repairs to the steeple and roof as needed. They also inspected all air ventilators to insure that that screens are intact.

Acorn Tree Service removed two dead Ash trees from the Masonic side of the Parsonage. We have had to replace the kitchen range in the Parsonage first floor rear apartment.

We have a weird problem, when pumping three feet of water from the elevator pit, it was discovered the water was flooding back into the custodian closet. We are reviewing the entire building drainage system piping and catch basins. If anyone has past history related to this problem, please contact me.

I have discussed with the kitchen committee the removal of the unused food warming device and the dishwasher that does not work and installing a booster heater for hot water. The cabinets under the serving counter would be updated.

We continue to have a strong financial result, with nearly a 40k surplus at this point in the year. International Day Of Prayer

This November, millions of Christians worldwide will unite for one cause: to join the global Body of Christ for the 2021 International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted (IDOP). The number one thing persecuted Christians ask for is prayer and these monthly updates are our way of helping you to meet their request. We will recognize this remembrance on November 14th.

We publish these monthly updates so that you can get an idea of the scope of persecution in the 21st century. It varies by country but the source of persecution is typically one of the following: Communist ideology; Radical Islam; driven by culture. The ultimate source is of course our enemy Satan himself, but he works through worldly powers and individuals to accomplish his purposes. That is why prayer is the primary need when combating persecution.

Persecution has been on the rise this century and the case of Nigeria is a good example of this. Radical Islamic militant groups such as Boko Haram and Fulani militants have decimated Christian communities throughout northern Nigeria. In the last 18 years, an estimated 50,000 to 70,000 Christians have been murdered by these groups, while another 2 million people have been displaced. Countries such as Russia and China which became reasonably open to the gospel are now clamping down so that once again having a Christian witness there can easily result in government action being taken.

None of this should be a surprise to us for Jesus told His disciples in Matthew 24:9 "Then you will be handed over to be persecuted and put to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of me."

Like those who are suffering today our response should be Luke 24:28 "When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."


Retired Ministers and Missionary Offering

Stewardship Moment



Our Stewardship Campaign for 2021 kicks off the first week of November. We hope you will join us each week as we explore the theme, "Faithful, Hopeful, Loving." You may have already received a letter introducing the program and some additional materials for you to reflect on and pray over.

Here is an overview of what we will be talking about. It begins with the thirteenth chapter of 1 Corinthians. Generosity is indeed a matter of the heart. A good steward has a faithful, hopeful, and loving heart. Faithfulness is God's measurement for Christians. All of us are called to be faithful to God's mission and purpose. Hopefulness is a basic Christian characteristic. God offers the victory of hope through Christ. God is still at work in the world, and we partner in these acts of redemption through our generosity. Generosity is a loving response, made in gratitude for God's love for us. The Apostle Paul concludes this chapter by telling us that faith, hope, and love last. During our stewardship emphasis, we will encourage each other to support our mission and ministry by sharing our time, our God-given talents, and our financial resources. Paul closes out this classic passage by reminding us that even if we practice generosity, if our gifts have not been given in the spirit of love, then we have gained nothing. So let's encourage one another to faithfully and lovingly come together to share the hope of the gospel with the world around us.

But his wife's sickness continued, so friends and neighbors came to sit with her around the clock. To feed them, the farmer butchered the pig.


The farmer's wife did not get well; she died. So many people came for her funeral, the farmer had the cow slaughtered to provide enough meat for all of them.




