Our Planned Giving was less than planned in March but the annual gifts donated in January give us a year-to-date surplus. The expenses exceeded the planned amount due to high fuel costs and prepaying for the Women's Retreat. That resulted in a net deficit for the month of around \$11,524. However, the year-to-date total is a surplus of over \$3,401, so we have sufficient funds to meet our needs for the future. Your continued generous donations and faithful support allows Central Baptist to serve our members and community. Thank you so much!



# **Board of Missions**

For years Central Baptist Church has supported the mission and work of many missionaries from International Ministries. International Ministries (IM), also known as the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society, works cross-culturally to invite people to become disciples of Jesus Christ and to proclaim, through both word and deed, God's reign of justice, peace and abundant life for all creation. The oldest international Baptist mission agency in North America, International Ministries (IM) has been responding to the call of Jesus Christ since 1814. This month we will look at the work of three of the missionaries that our church community supports throughout the year.

Mercy Gonzalez-Barnes

Mercy is a regional consultant in theological education and leadership development in Latin America and the Caribbean. Mercy teaches, mentors, and walks alongside men and women that are following God's call in their lives. She provides resources such as retreats and workshops to help her colleagues and fellow missionaries. Mercy is also part of a team of global servants that are collaborating with Palmer Seminary in a NEW Online master's in theological studies in Spanish. This new program makes higher education accessible to many who would not have the opportunity otherwise.

**Christine Lafferty** 

Christy has been serving God and her brothers and sisters in Nicaragua since 2012 as a part of AMOS Health and Hope. This program provides preventive and curative health services to remote communities with no doctors. Christy facilitates short-term mission opportunities, engages churches and individuals as partners in longterm ministry, and helps create multi-media content that helps share the stories of the people being touched by AMOS's ministry. She lives in Managua, Nicaragua, with her husband, Abel, and their son, AJ.

**Katherine & Wayne Niles** 

Katherine and Wayne serve in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Wayne works with IMA World Health assisting in the management of health, development, and relief projects. The health projects strive to increase access to quality health care for many vulnerable communities. Katherine is medical coordinator for the network of rural Baptist Hospitals staffed entirely by Christian Congolese professionals. She works to obtain much needed medicine and medical equipment such as ultrasound machines. Together with Wayne they also organize the installation of solar power and computer systems.

May God continue to watch over and protect these men and women as they continue to serve Him and the communities in which they live.

# The Persecuted Church

# Persecution in the Western World

The Western World, by which we mean Western Europe and North America, has been on the forefront of proclaiming the truth of the Gospel since the 16<sup>th</sup> century, beginning with the Reformation and the spread of Protestantism westward from Germany. Initially the impetus was persecution from the Roman Church as it responded to Luther's attempt to transform it from within, which drove its proponents to evangelize the countries less under the sway of Papal rule.

As Protestantism gained ascendancy in these countries, such as the Scandinavian lands and the countries bordering the North sea like Holland and England, the established Protestant churches such as the Church of England, persecuted those who dared to challenge the leadership of these State churches. This resulted in our own country being established by worshipers of God fleeing that persecution. What we see driving the persecution is disagreement with those who hold the reins of power.

In modern times we see the most egregious persecution from a powerful government happening in China, first when the Communist government took power in 1949 and more recently as Xi Jinping tightens his grip on power. Lest we think this phenomenon is limited to Asia I will give some examples of what is now happening in the West.

In Finland former Finnish interior minister Paivi Rasanen has gone on trial for hate speech against gay people, following comments referencing verses from the Bible which condemn homosexual acts as sinful. She was questioning why the Finnish Lutheran Church was officially supporting Finland's Pride week. Despite being acquitted in March 2022 she and her Bishop are still being pursued in court by the Finnish government.

In England Isabel Vaughan-Spruce and Father Sean Gough were charged with praying silently in an abortion facility censorship zone. Although they were acquitted, the UK government has just passed a law criminalizing all activities that could be construed as being "influential" within 500 ft of any clinic performing abortions. Isabel Vaughan-Spruce has recently been arrested again for the same activity as she was acquitted of previously.


In California a physical education teacher, Jessica Tapia was fired for refusing to tell lies about biological reality or hide students' gender transitions from their parents. Jurupa Unified School District fired her on January 31 st after determining it could not accommodate her religious beliefs. The cost of following Christ can be high in this increasingly secular society. This is but one example of many recent job terminations caused by Christians voicing their beliefs in the Biblical view of sexuality and marriage and the value of human life.

Jesus said in John 15:18 "If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first." Paul says in 2 Timothy 3:12 "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." But Jesus said in John 16:33 "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

So let us be prayerfully ready to stand for Christ as the Devil increases his attacks against God's people because he knows his time is short.
