PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

I always loved Christmas morning. My younger brother and I would get up very early in anticipation of what was to come. With eyes wide open, we'd view the gifts that had been wrapped and prepared for us and get giddy with anticipation. That's the same feeling I get every September as we launch a new year of worship & education at church. Instead of Matchbox cars and G. I. Joes, the gifts come in the Small Group Bible studies being offered. The gifts are wrapped up around meaningful worship opportunities. There is something for everyone.

Elsewhere in the newsletter you will find short descriptions of these studies. We have brochures and sign up sheets in Fellowship Hall. They are being offered at various times to meet the needs of all who'd like to attend. Personally, I am excited to lead a study on the Book of Romans. It is a deep dive into classical Christian theology. The Apostle Paul lays out the basics of our faith. It offers an understanding of what Christ did, and why we need to be saved. To make it easier on people's schedules, I'm calling the Wednesday night study, "Pasta with Paul." Each week at 5:30 pm we will offer a simple dinner option. I've got Skip Terwilliger and others helping. From 6:00 pm—7:00 pm we will take on a chapter a week. Sign up now.

There is something special about coming back to worship after a bit of a summer break. It is like the first day of school was for many of us growing up. We get to see all our friends. We come together to worship the Lord with a renewed sense of enthusiasm and commitment. The music, the preaching, and the fellowship offer us the opportunity to reignite our faith and propel us into a year of meaningful service to Christ. Overall, the financial picture is very positive with revenue ahead of the year-to-date planned amounts and expenses slightly over, but very close to the planned amount.

Expenses through the end of July are tracking slightly higher than the Year-to-Date financial plan as shown by the fact that the Year-to-Date actual expenses are \$4,615.34 (1.5%) higher than the Year-to-Date planned expenses. Revenue for the first 7 months of the year is slightly ahead of the planned amounts with the actual at \$308,699.33 versus the planned amount of \$297,060.26. A review of major revenue line items shows that planned giving is 4.5% above the year-to-date planned budget and transfer of trust funds is approximately 10.5% below year-to-date planned amounts while all other revenue lines are close to year-to-date planned budget amounts.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!



Board of Missions

It is hard to believe that summer is almost over (September 22) and that the kids are already back to school. With many families struggling to put food on the table, the return to school is a huge help to their budgets as their children will be back to receiving nutritious lunches and even breakfast at school. However, many still struggle with the weekend and during school holiday breaks. Backpack food programs provide nutritious, non-perishable, easy-to-prepare food to children to ensure they get enough food on weekends and holidays to avoid hunger when they can't depend on school meals.

The Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center (PNC) and The Jonnycake Center both have Weekender Backpack Programs. The PNC alone provides these bags to nearly 300 school-aged students in need that reside in Mystic, Stonington, North Stonington, and Westerly. The Jonnycake's Power Pack Program works to supplement the nutrition for students of eligible families in Westerly, Hopkinton, Charlestown, and Richmond who depend on access to meals at school.

For the month of September, the Mission Board will be collecting items that are needed for these back-pack programs. A box will be on the stage in the church hall. We are looking for the following items:

- · Individually wrapped breakfast items like oatmeal packets, granola bars, cereal cups
- · Easy to prepare meals like mac and cheese cups, soups with pop top lids, chef Boyardee microwave pastas
- · Individual fruit cups or applesauce cups or pouches
- · Snacks such as individually wrapped cookies, crackers, chips, gummy snacks.

Stewardship Moment

A visitor to Westminster Abbey in London will find these words on the burial place of Christopher Chapman who died in 1680:

What I gave, I have. What I spent, I had. What I left, I lost by not giving it.

What I gave, I have



Are the words true as far as your experience is concerned? Surely the words point in the direction of what those who have practiced Christian stewardship have discovered over the years.

Good stewards soon learn that what they have given, they still have ... not in dollars and cents ... but in the lingering joy that comes from the realization that their gifts have made a lasting difference on behalf of the Kingdom of God. For example, a church has been built, a Christian school has been supported, housing for the homeless has been subsidized, a home has been provided for children from dysfunctional families, missionaries have been supplied funds for their work, and so on. Gifts for such noble enterprises are never lost. When we give to them we see the lasting effect of our gifts throughout our life. Therefore, the words are true: What I gave, I have.

What I spent, I had

The epitaph goes on: What I spent, I had. There is nothing wrong with spending money, of course, especially if we spend it wisely. Indeed, spending money helps others, in the sense that it keeps the economy humming, keeps people working, and "greases the wheels of commerce" as the saying goes.

How terribly destitute many countries are whose citizens have almost nothing to spend. Some economists call them "basket cases" and they are. Economically they are "down the line" in the so-called Third World, another name for poverty-stricken and bankrupt.

Ah, but most of us do have something to spend and we do just that. Many of us spend, spend, and spend some more without being frugal, without making sure we are also saving and planning for the future. Many seem unwilling to acknowledge that hard times can do us in, can leave us "basket cases" ourselves. When we spend foolishly and without cognizance of the "lean years" that are certain to come, the likelihood is that one day we will realize that Chapman's words are true: "What I spent, I had."

What I left, I lost by not giving it

Chapman's last words may be the most insightful of all: What I left, I lost by not giving it.

Ultimately, we lose everything, don't we? We leave earth empty-handed. Even if money were buried with us, as in the case of a man whose family put coins in his burial suit in case he need- ed to make a phone call, it would be to no avail. When we die, we die losers ... total losers. Unless. Unless we have made arrangements for our worldly goods to be given to worthy people and worthy causes. When we leave earth, we lose ... but only if we are guilty of not providing for a meaningful distribution of what God has lent to us for our journey on earth.

Responsible stewardship

Responsible stewardship requires such forethought. A good steward will have an updated legal will and will make certain that it provides for those people and the Christian work the steward has cherished far into the future.

Indeed, it is possible for a gift to continue as long as earth lasts if it is handled right and divested wisely. When such resources are properly designated by us, we will never have to worry about them vanishing when we go home to God. We will never have to acknowledge Chapman's words as being applicable for us: "What I left I lost by not giving it."


